What is it?

Wood Badge brings together leaders from all areas of Scouting, Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting, and Venturing, for six days of fun, fellowship, and training, spread over two, three-day, weekends.

The **first weekend** involves instruction and practical experience in modern leadership principles. Instruction centers on the five core themes of Wood Badge:

- Living the Values
- Bringing the Vision to Life
- Models for Success
- Tools of the Trade
- Leading to Make a Difference

The **second weekend** applies what was learned during the first weekend. You will create and carry out a plan of action to improve your unit, your District, your Council, and yourself. Upon certified completion, you will earn the Wood Badge course recognition: the graduate neckerchief, beads, and woggle.



Who Should Attend?

Every Scout Leader!

Wood Badge is a comprehensive training course started by Baden-Powell himself to help leaders hone their skills, extend their understanding of youth and other adults, and to go on to new levels of personal growth and learning as Scouters.

Scouters may apply to attend the course if they have met the following prerequisites:

- Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America age 18 or older.
- Complete the basic training courses for their registered Scouting position.
- Completed parts A, B, and C of the BSA Health Form within the 12 months prior to the last weekend of the course. Part C is required for everyone.
